### SAINT ANNE

Feast: July 26

Died: 1st Century B.C.

Anne and her husband, Joachim, lived in Nazareth before Christ was born. They had no children, so they prayed for a child for many years.

At last a daughter was born to Anne. She was called Miriam or "Mary." Anne taught Mary to read the Scriptures, and she offered her to God in the service of the Temple.

Years later Mary returned to Nazareth. The Archangel Gabriel appeared and told Mary that she would be the Mother of the Son of God.

Anne prayed only for a child and she became mother of the Mother of God!
